

ABOUT MALAYSIAN TECHNICAL COOPERATION PROGRAMME (MTCP)

The Malaysian Technical Cooperation Programme (MTCP) was officially launched on 7 September 1980 at the Commonwealth Heads of State Meeting in New Delhi, India, to signify Malaysia's commitment to the South-South Cooperation, in particular, the Technical Cooperation among Developing Countries (TDC).

The MTCP emphasizes on the development of human resources through the provision of training in various areas which are essential for a country's development such as agriculture, economy, finance, public management and administration, science & technology and ICT, health diplomacy, safety and security including cyber security, cultural diplomacy, social development, environment-related to SDG2030, education, industrial and technical training. Annually, Malaysia offered more than 60 technical and capacity-building programs under the MTCP, which have benefited more than 35,500 participants from 144 countries.

OBJECTIVES OF MTCP

- To share the development experience with other countries;
- To strengthen bilateral relations between Malaysia and other developing countries;
- To promote South-South Cooperation (SSC); and
- To promote the technical cooperation among developing countries.

ABOUT MULTIMEDIA UNIVERSITY

In 1996, the government of Malaysia was looking for methods to liberalise higher education in the nation, and to involve the private education sector in the development of this critical sector of human capital building. In October 1996, the then Telekom Malaysia was given the distinction by the Ministry of Education to set up the first private University in Malaysia. Being a natural extension of the existing ITM campuses that TM already runs, TM accepted the invitation and Universiti Telekom was established in Melaka. A year later, with the planning of the MSC underway, the government was once again looking for a suitable candidate to construct a university in the heart of the MSC. In March 1997, TM was again honoured when it was given the task to set up this university, to be known as Multimedia University. Considering that the telecommunications industry was becoming closely linked with developments in ICT, expansion into an education field directly related to ICT is a natural strategic decision. MMU vision is to transform society through innovation while our mission is to inquire, inspire and innovate through Quality Student and Staff Engaged in Innovative Academic Programmes and Research driven by Academic and Commercial Revenue streams.

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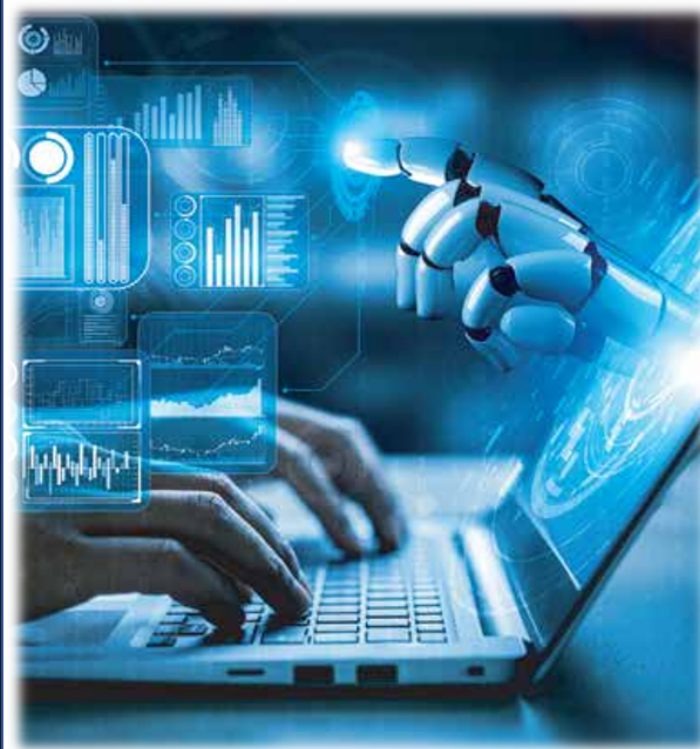

ABOUT THE COURSE

Education 4.0 is an answer to the needs of IR4.0, where new possibilities are associated with humans and technology. In other words, teaching and learning is a method of evolution. The emergence of the COVID-19 virus has turned the landscape of teaching and learning on its head. Teaching and learning has progressed to an online world from a complete teacher or classroom-dependent stage. Blended learning and Flipped classroom are the method of education that have gained traction in the developing world.

Students can learn something without limitations in the blended learning environment, as blended learning offers students the opportunity for self-directed study. We are also moving toward Hyflex learning approach. HyFlex is a course design model that provides hybrid learning components in a flexible course framework that allows students to attend sessions in the classroom, participate online, or do both. This training will provide more sophisticated and useful exercises for the present time. E-learning techniques and hyflex strategies can also be useful for non-educational background such as engineers to present their project to the client or trainers conducting their training.

TARGETED PARTICIPANTS

A candidate is eligible for admission only if he/she meets the following requirements:

- Educators (school teachers, college lecturers, university lecturers) or anyone who is interested in e-learning
- Each participant must possess basic knowledge of IT
- Each participant must ensure that he/she has at least a 5 Mbps internet speed for both uploading and downloading speed
- Must not be more than 50 years of age.
- Each participant is expected to have a digital computer.
- Must ensure that he/she has never participated in any previous MTCP courses organised by Multimedia University or other Malaysian implementing agencies.
- This course will be conducted in English. Therefore, participants are required to have an appropriate level of proficiency in English, written as well as spoken.
- The training will be fully conducted online, via Google Meet platform.
- Participants must seek permission from their superior to attend the course.
- Comply with other general requirements for MTCP.

GENERAL CONDITION OF PARTICIPATION

Etiquette

Participants shall conduct themselves at all times in a manner compatible with their responsibilities as MTCP scholarship holders and abide by the laws, rules and regulations of the land and institutions.

Participants shall follow the programme approved for them. Request for change of the programme will not be entertained. Participants should fully participate in all activities related to the programme.

Certificate will only be awarded to participants that attend at least 80% of the training. Participants are required to notify MMU if they are not able to attend the session.

The participation may be terminated at any time due to unsatisfactory conduct, breach of the conditions of the course, failure to make satisfactory progress or as necessary by Malaysian training institution with the approval of the MTCP Secretariat

APPLICATION GUIDELINES

1. The course fees are fully sponsored by the Government of Malaysia.

3. MTCP application forms can also be obtained from the nearest Malaysian Embassy/High Commission in recipient countries.
4. All application forms must be duly completed and endorsed by the Ministry of Foreign Affairs or National Focal/Aid Coordinator Agency in the respective countries and submitted ONLY through the diplomatic channel via the Embassy/High Commission of Malaysia.
5. Only successful applicants will receive the Official Invitation notification one (1) week from the course date, from MMU via email.
