Funicular Station

Built and managed by the German Rudolf Holtig. The funicular transported approximately 25 people to the beach.

Originally, it operated with a counterweight system using filtered seawater, later it was changed to the electric system.

Barranco Chapel

Here was built the first chapel in the area in thanksgiving to "El Señor del Barranco" [The Lord of the Ravine].

Then, people began settling around the Ermita de Barranco, which was made of adobe and quincha in the middle of the eighteenth century.

Municipal Park

In this beautiful park stand out the Danandé's statue, Barberini's Candelabra and the Putti, all of them worked in Carrara marble. Likewise, the Pergola is used for artistic and cultural shows.

Municipal Library

Opened on October 1, 1922. This neoclassic style building has classical porticos, columns, large windows, and a clock tower with the Barranco coat of arms on the lower section.



Bridge of Sighs

Opened on February 14, 1876. This bridge was built due to the need to connect the sides of the ravine. It is a welcoming place that was witness to countless romances and inspired many poets and composer, such as Chabuca Granda, who wrote the waltz "El Puente de los Suspiros".

Path to the Beach

This is a path through a natural ravine that leads to the beaches of Barranco. Its harmonious style has been maintained through the preservation of lovely ranch houses dating from the late nineteenth century and colorful vegetation, among which ficus trees and bougainvillea stand out. Early in the twentieth century, this path became well known as "Los Baños de Barranco".



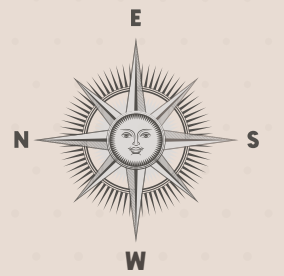
