

The Catalogue of the Peruvian Offer of International Technical Cooperation 2025 - 2026, presents 50 successful experiences developed by 28 Peruvian institutions

The experiences respond to eight sectors: i) Climate Change, Forests and Biodiversity; ii) Water, Sanitation and Water Resources; iii) Disaster Risk Management; iv) Sustainable Cities and Transportation; v) Citizen Security and Organized Crime; vi) Health and Food Safety; vii) Technological Innovation, ICTs and Production Chains and viii) Education, Inclusion and Gender Equality. In this regard, the main forms of cooperation offered are the exchange of experiences, short stays of experts, courses or seminars, internships, among others. All the offers can be granted in physical or virtual format, with Spanish being the prevailing language and English to a lesser extent.

Finally, APCI wishes to thank all the national institutions that collaborated with their valuable contributions, which enabled the preparation of this catalogue; and reaffirms its commitment to continue to maintain an active role in building consensus that strengthens and improves the hierarchy, scope and effectiveness of South-South and Triangular Cooperation, in line with national development priorities and positioning of Peru as a provider of technical cooperation.

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National Service of Natural Areas Protected by the State (SERNANP)

The National Service of Natural Areas Protected by the State (SERNANP) is the governing body of the National System of Natural Areas Protected by the State (SINANPE). As a technical-normative authority, its mission is to sustainably manage biological diversity and maintain ecosystem services that provide benefits to society, through participatory and coordinated management with regional and local governments and owners of properties recognized as private conservation areas through regulations, technical-administrative criteria, procedures, supervision and control of Natural Protected Areas (PNA) for the conservation of natural heritage and the sustainable development of the national economy.

Mechanisms for civil society participation in the management of Protected Natural Areas (PNA): Sustainable management, resource use and monitoring





Offer details

Peru leads the participatory management of Protected Natural Areas (PNA), integrating strategic actors and civil society. These initiatives promote local development, improved quality of life and the sustainability of resources. Peasant organizations, native communities, entrepreneurs, NGOs and extractors are involved in sustainable management, conservation and monitoring. In addition, monitoring tools are used to evaluate the impact and progress in the sustainability of the PNA and their surroundings.

Our offer focuses on the exchange of experiences and methodologies for the design of strategies, policies and instruments that promote the participation of non-state actors, such as communities, companies and NGOs, in the management of Protected Natural Areas (PNA).



Experience

In 2018, the Amazon Region 2.0 Project of the International Union for Conservation of Nature (IUCN) facilitated an exchange of experiences in Purús, Brazil, focusing on training for community surveillance and training of environmental monitors. In 2023, the management of marine-coastal areas in the Tropical Sea of Peru was strengthened through an exchange with Costa Rica, training specialists in protected natural areas. In addition, in 2023, Colombia and Peru participated in the Triangular Cooperation Project called CIAPCOPE, which was developed to address "comprehensive and shared solutions to the common problem of illicit cultivation in protected natural areas and their buffer zones in Colombia and Peru."

The Ministry of the Environment (MINAM) promotes the conservation and sustainable use of natural resources, the enhancement of biological diversity and environmental quality for the benefit of people and the environment in a decentralized manner and in coordination with public and private organizations and civil society, within the framework of green growth and environmental governance. MINAM plans, directs, executes, supervises and evaluates the National Environmental Policy (PNA) applicable to all levels of government, directs the National Environmental Management System (SNGA) and the National Environmental Impact Assessment System (SEIA), exercising leadership of the Environmental Sector.

Offer details

The International Convention on the Conservation of Wild Fauna and Flora (CITES) is responsible for ensuring that international trade in endangered wild species does not cause ecological harm and is carried out under sustainability criteria. Non-Detrimental Extraction Findings (NDF) are one of the main tools for assessing the risk of international trade in wild fauna and flora, in order to ensure its sustainability over time. The Ministry of the Environment (MINAM) has trained and experienced human capital in the formulation of NDFs for flora and fauna, both terrestrial and aquatic.

Our offer is based on the design of methodologies based on biological analysis, the development of practical cases, strategic guidelines and policies that allow us to contribute new knowledge, through experiences to share with the scientific authorities of CITES and its collaborators.



Experience

Peru has a history of practical cases in flora and fauna that include CITES species. This experience has allowed us to develop training and instruction events for the issuance of NDFs with CITES members in several Latin American countries of the Amazon Cooperation Treaty Organization (ACTO): Brazil, Bolivia, Colombia, Ecuador, Guyana, Suriname and Venezuela. In addition, in the Amazon region, together with the Scientific Authority of Germany and Traffic, the first workshop for the preparation of NDFs was held.

Instruments for the efficient use of materials and solid waste management





Offer details

Through various strategies, the Ministry of the Environment (MINAM) addresses the existing problem regarding the comprehensive management of solid waste at the national, provincial and district levels. In response to this, it provides technical assistance to local governments to strengthen their capacities in the proper management and handling of solid waste in their respective jurisdictions. Our offer is based on the design of methodologies for the formulation of instruments that optimise the efficient use of materials and the management of solid waste.



Experience

Peru, through the Comprehensive Solid Waste Management Law (LGIRS), managed to regulate the management of solid waste, its control infrastructures, reuse and recovery activities, as well as its material and energy valorisation. Its spectrum of action covers the regulation of the public cleaning service, establishing the minimum conditions for its execution through the promotion of public and private, municipal and non-municipal initiatives, for the reduction of generation and danger, as well as valorisation and adequate management of waste based on coordination and agreement with sectoral authorities, regional governments and local governments. In 2020, a Binational Cabinet (Peru-Bolivia) was created for the integral management of solid waste, prioritizing its minimization and valorisation through the circular economy approach. The objective was sustainable production and consumption with a global and local perspective through the efficient use of natural resources and the reduction of polluting emissions through prevention, recycling and reuse, both in consumption and production.

Economic instruments for the sustainable management of ecosystem services





Offer details

Peru, through the economic and financial instruments of its General Directorate of Economics and Environmental Financing, designs and promotes public and private investment for the conservation and sustainable use of biodiversity, ecosystem services and environmental protection. Its guidelines are materialized in the Mechanisms for Retribution for Ecosystem Services (MERESE) developed by the Ministry of the Environment (MINAM), which contribute to dynamizing its implementation at the national level together with other ecosystem services and actors, in order to contribute to closing gaps in degraded ecosystems. Our offer is based on the design of economic and financial instruments for the sustainability and improvement of ecosystem services.



Experience

In 2014, Peru enacted the Law on Mechanisms of Retribution for Ecosystem Services (MERESE), and since 2021, through a program of exchange of experiences between Peru, Chile and Costa Rica, the common theme is addressed. This implementation had positive effects and is currently applied through policies and instruments for dissemination and institutional strengthening aimed at the conservation, recovery and sustainable use of natural infrastructure at the international level in countries such as Colombia, Ecuador and Costa Rica.

Environmental crimes, justice and environmental defenders





Offer details

Between 2015 and 2023, Peru registered 71,251 complaints for environmental crimes, with an increase in cases, especially related to natural resources. To address this, in 2021 the Functional Unit for Environmental Crimes (UNIDA) of MINAM was created, focused on the prevention and analysis of crimes such as illegal logging, wildlife trafficking and illegal mining.

Our offer focuses on the exchange of experiences related to the intersectoral mechanism for the protection of human rights defenders, as well as the design and proposal of regulatory and institutional improvements to prevent and reduce the committing of environmental crimes and infractions. In this context, MINAM implemented the Sectoral Protocol for the Protection of Environmental Defenders, which allows for the identification and reporting of risks. UNIDA is responsible for channelling these cases to the Ministry of Justice and Human Rights.



Experience

During the first session of the High-Level Commission for the Prevention and Reduction of Environmental Crimes (CANDAM) in November 2024, the members approved the proposal for the National Strategy for the Prevention and Reduction of Environmental Crimes, formulated by UNIDA with the collaboration of CANDAM members. This strategy will benefit vulnerable populations affected by illegal economies that cause environmental impacts.



Forest and Wildlife Resources Supervisory Agency (OSINFOR)

OSINFOR is the entity in charge, at the national level, of supervising and monitoring the use and conservation of forest and wildlife resources, as well as environmental services from the forest, for their sustainability, in accordance with the national policy and strategy for integrated management of natural resources and the policies on environmental services established by the Ministry of the Environment, within its area of competence.

Application of selective logging algorithms in the Amazon to detect forest crimes





Offer details

OSINFOR, as the entity in charge of supervising forest and wildlife use rights in Peru, uses information technologies, such as machine learning algorithms, to detect illegal logging in the Amazon region.

Our offer focuses on sharing our experience with the mechanism for the detection of forest crimes, which uses algorithms to analyse radar and optical satellite images to identify logging disturbances in specific areas. During the inspection process, it is verified whether the movements of timber products come from authorized areas. If no disturbances are detected, the products are considered as originated by illegal logging.

Experience

From January to November 2024, the mechanism for detecting forest crimes monitored more than 1 million hectares, detecting 23,164 m3 of illegally extracted timber, equivalent to more than 500 truckloads worth more than 17 million soles. Developed in collaboration with academics and international experts, its effectiveness in the fight against illegal logging in the Amazon makes it a valuable model to be replicated in other countries in Latin America and the Caribbean.

Use and application of the Forest Backpack methodology





Offer details

Our offer is based on the application and use of La Mochila Forestal, a participatory, intercultural and inclusive tool, with a gender focus, created to train and empower indigenous communities to the sustainable management of their forests. Since its launch in 2013, it has allowed communities to learn in a simple way about legal access to forest resources, avoiding illegal logging and non-compliance with forest legislation. The tool includes a flannel board and an audio-visual device to facilitate training in any environment. In addition, the Forest Backpack has been registered as an original creation of OSINFOR, supporting its commitment to forest protection.



Experience

Between 2022 and 2024, an exchange of experiences was carried out to strengthen the comprehensive management system of the forest reserves of the Santiago de Cali District, through the co-creation of the Forest Backpack "Estructura Ecológica de Cali" in collaboration with the Administrative Department of Environmental Management (DAGMA) of Colombia. During this process, leaders and specialists were trained in the use of the Forest Backpack. In addition, in Honduras, the development of technical capacities in indigenous peoples for community forest management of their natural resources was promoted, with the training of the team of the Forest Conservation Institute (ICF) in the use of the Forest Backpack and the adaptation of four of its themes to the Honduran context.

Technical assistance in the Forest Alerts methodology





Offer details

Our offer is based on the exchange and transfer of experiences on the Forest Alerts activation mechanism, an OSINFOR methodology that transmits information in a timely manner to the Specialized Prosecutors for Environmental Matters (FEMA) and to the Regional Forest Authorities upon detection of environmental criminal offenses, such as illegal logging, or administrative infractions. Its objective is to achieve coordinated and immediate action between the Public Prosecutor's Office, regional authorities and OSINFOR to prevent damage to forest heritage and combat illegal logging. This methodology is adaptable to different crimes, such as deforestation and fires, and is adjusted to the specific needs and contexts of each country, promoting sustainability and learning from the process.



Experience

Between 2022 and 2024, significant progress was made in Honduras, such as strengthening the capabilities of officials from the General Directorate of the Environment of the National General Prosecutor's Office (PGR) and professionals from the National Institute for Forest Conservation and Development, Protected Areas and Wildlife (ICF). Likewise, technical assistance was provided on the OSINFOR forest alert methodology, as a timely action mechanism for the prevention of forest crimes in the country. In addition, the "Methodological proposal for the implementation of Forest Alerts in the Honduran context" was approved and disseminated, with the aim of supporting the fight against environmental crimes.

SENACE evaluates the environmental viability of the most complex investment projects in the country, with technical soundness and promoting effective citizen participation, generating confidence in the population into the environmental assessment process. Its mission is to provide a certification service for environmental impact studies of investment projects to public and private institutions in a timely, transparent manner, with technical and reliable quality that promotes the sustainable development of the country.

Social Management Tool: Intercultural Classroom and environmental certification





Offer details

Our offer is based on the methodology of the Social Management Tool: "Intercultural Classroom", designed to strengthen capabilities and promote informed citizen participation in environmental certification processes, with intercultural and gender equity approaches. Aimed at diverse populations such as indigenous and Afro-descendant people, this tool has been implemented in Peru since 2020, with 90 training processes and 2,553 people trained. It has been recognized as a Good Public Management Practice by *Ciudadanos al Día* (CAD) and the Ministry of Culture of Peru, contributing to greater preparation of the population to participate in investment projects.



Experience

The project was presented at the Latin American Network of Environmental Impact Assessment Systems (REDLASEIA), which includes Argentina, Brazil, Chile, Colombia, Costa Rica, Ecuador, Mexico, Paraguay and Uruguay. In this framework, SENACE presented the methodology of the Social Management Mechanism "Intercultural Classroom" and its benefits for promoting early citizen participation in environmental certification processes, as well as for generating confidence in the population regarding said processes. This approach sparked the interest of the entities of the countries, and the information is being systematized to be published on the REDLASEIA portal, where it will be available for consultation by members and to evaluate possible future internships.

Details of the offer

Proamazonas manages four sanitary landfills to promote the proper management of solid waste, with the aim of increasing tourist visits to the southern Amazon basins and contributing to the sustainable development of local governments and rural communities.

Our offer includes the transfer of experience through specialized courses and technical assistance to subnational governments, using the Japanese semi-aerobic Fukuoka method for integrated solid waste management (ISWM). In addition, landfills are used as multifunctional spaces for academic internships, biological studies and training for municipal and community staff, thus strengthening the socioeconomic and environmental development of the region.



Experience

Integrated solid waste management (ISWM) improves the scenic beauty of the areas Involved, which increases tourist visits to various tourist resources in the basin (Kuelap Fortress, Gocta Waterfall, Yumbilla Waterfall, Quiocta Caverns, Leymebamba Museum, Revash Archaeological Site, among others), thus promoting local economic growth. The Fukuoka method, used in this process, accelerates the degradation of waste through oxygen, reducing the generation of methane and improving leachate. In addition, it promotes the production of compost for family farming and promotes recycling through organized groups.

Environmental Assessment and Oversight Agency (OEFA)

The Environmental Assessment and Oversight Agency (OEFA) is the governing body of the Environmental Assessment and Oversight System (SINEFA). As the main environmental oversight agency, it has the function of verifying that natural and legal people comply with the provisions of environmental legislation in order to safeguard the balance between economic investment and environmental protection, contributing to the sustainable development of the country. It also supervises that the Environmental Oversight Entities (EFA) at the national, regional or local level, carry out their functions in accordance with the provisions of the National Environmental Policy through their regulatory and sanctioning powers.

Our offer is based on the design of technical exchange panels on environmental oversight through spaces for dialogue between international specialists and researchers on environmental oversight, as well as the assistance from technical and legal experts on issues that are the responsibility of the Environmental Assessment and Oversight Agency (OEFA) with the aim of generating new contributions on research proposals.



Experience

Since 2018, the Environmental Assessment and Oversight Agency (OEFA) has developed peer review processes through the analysis of cases and technical-scientific information in exchange panels between invited experts from international technical cooperation and OEFA teams. Between 2018 and 2021, 12 national and international peer technical exchanges were held with institutions such as the United States Agency for International Development (USAID) and the United States Forest Service, where topics related to the oversight of sectors such as mining, hydrocarbons, industry, solid waste, agriculture, fisheries and environmental health were addressed.

Strategies for the reduction of atmospheric pollutants generated by the cultivation of sugar cane and their direct benefit to the community





Offer details

Peru, an important producer of sugar cane, uses this crop to produce sugar and ethanol. However, burning before harvest, used to reduce costs, causes air pollution and affects the health of nearby communities.

Our proposal focuses on the exchange of experiences and perspectives to facilitate the transfer of learning. In this context, technical assistance is offered to mitigate the following impacts: (i) Assessment of air quality in areas affected by sugarcane crops; (ii) Data collection; (iii) Application of pollutant dispersion models; (iv) Design of regulations and; (v) Development of strategies to ensure compliance with regulations.



Experience

In 2018, OEFA used the AERMOD software, an atmospheric pollutant dispersion model used to analyse the dispersion of substances in the air. This model was used in localities in the province of Paita, department of Piura, affected by the burning of sugarcane, establishing distances and burning times required to the company Agroaurora S.A.C. This reduced pollutants to levels close to the World Health Organization (WHO) standards, benefiting the population of La Huaca and La Rinconada. In addition, a law was enacted to regulate this practice and promote sustainable harvesting methods, and a technical manual was published by the National Meteorological and Hydrological Service of Peru (SENAMHI) on dispersion modelling, useful for managing environmental impacts.









National Water Authority (ANA)

The National Water Authority (ANA) promotes water culture and is the highest technical-regulatory authority of the National Water Resources Management System (SNGRH). It was created in 2008 with the objective of managing, conserving, protecting and using the water resources of the different basins in a sustainable manner for the benefit of water users and the population. Its functions include the administration and monitoring of natural water sources, the authorization of discharge and reuse of wastewater treated by water service providers and the evaluation of environmental instruments.

Offer details

The "water footprint" is an environmental indicator to determine the volume of fresh water and the costs implicit in the manufacture of goods and services. The "Blue Certificate" is a Peruvian initiative, unique and unprecedented in Latin America, which recognizes companies that make the commitment to offset the impact of water use in their operations. It is a public-private instrument based on ISO 14046 methodologies developed by the National Water Authority (ANA) of Peru, the Swiss Agency for Development and Cooperation (COSUDE) and the 2030 WRG for the integrated management of water resources.

Our offer is based on methodologies for the design of strategies and policies that incorporate technologies and innovations in water efficiency, aligned with productive processes for the benefit of the community to contribute to sustainable environmental management.



Experience

Since 2015, through the "Blue Certificate", Peru has promoted policies for efficiency and improved water quality. Its implementation has meant achievements such as: 1) More than 3 million cubic meters of water savings, 2) Reuse of 477 thousand cubic meters of water and 3) Improvement of the treatment of 140 thousand cubic meters of water. Through this initiative, 42 thousand people have benefited directly and indirectly and an investment of more than 2.5 million dollars has been promoted from the private sector. These experiences have been shared as a public-private management model with the member countries of the Global Water Partnership in South America (GWP).

Methodologies for Integrated Water Resources Management (IWRM)





Offer details

Integrated Water Resources Management (IWRM) is a process that promotes, within the scope of the hydrographic basin, the coordinated management and development of the multisectoral use and exploitation of water with the natural resources linked to it. The objective is the development of the country without compromising the sustainability of ecosystems.

Our offer is based on the design of strategies and policies that replace the traditional and fragmented approach to the management and exploitation of water, with a multilevel, multifactorial and multisectoral approach, highlighting its economic, social and environmental value for the common good through a philosophy of equality and sustainability.



Experience

In 2019, together with the Secretariat of Natural Resources and Environment of Honduras, the General Water Law was implemented for the benefit of that country. The principles and regulations applicable to the comprehensive sustainable management of water resources at the national level were established, including their protection, conservation, valorisation and multisectoral use.

National Superintendence of Sanitation Services (SUNASS)

The National Superintendence of Sanitation Services (SUNASS) is a decentralized public body with public law status and administrative, functional, technical, economic and financial autonomy. Its function is to regulate, supervise and inspect the provision of sanitation services, safeguarding in an impartial and objective manner the interests of the State, investors and users. Its functions seek to guarantee the provision of sanitation services in urban and rural areas with quality standards, so as to contribute to the health of the population and the preservation of the environment. It imposes sanctions for non-compliance with obligations arising from legal or technical standards, as well as with obligations assumed by contracted concessionaires.

Offer details

MERESE are mechanisms aimed at the conservation, recovery and sustainable use of ecosystem service sources, where an agreement is established between contributor(s) and payer(s) to the service to generate, channel, transfer and invest economic, financial and non-financial resources for the benefit of the community and the environment. The National Superintendence of Sanitation Services (SUNASS) promotes the conservation of water-providing ecosystems, avoiding the degradation of hydrogeological basins to provide a higher quality and lower cost drinking water service.

Our offer is based on the design of strategies to link drinking water companies with their hydrogeological basins and contribute to the maintenance of water ecosystem services, through the implementation of Mechanisms for Retribution for Water Ecosystem Services (MERESE-H) for the benefit of the community and the environment.



Experience

In 2017, together with the Costa Rican Institute of Aqueducts and Sewers (AyA), a program was successfully developed to design and implement a sanitation fee capable of incorporating an economic retribution for ecosystem services. In addition, in 2019, another program was developed to strengthen the Authority for the Supervision and Social Control of Drinking Water and Basic Sanitation (AAPS) of Bolivia based on the Peruvian experience in the field. In both cases, new contributions were generated in technical capacities for the benefit of professionals and technicians from both institutions.

The program seeks to determine how much the consumption of firewood and the greenhouse gases produced by biomass stoves inside a home can be reduced, based on evaluation and certification techniques with the aim of reducing the rate of different diseases (respiratory conditions, vision, etc.) associated with the high emissions of carbon monoxide emitted by these traditional stoves. Our offer is based on the design of evaluation processes for biomass stoves in the field and laboratory by applying protocols, technical standards and regulations through comparative studies, considering energy efficiency, safety, durability, intra-domiciliary concentration of carbon monoxide and particulate matter (MP 2,5).



Experience

Energising Development (EnDev) is a global alliance funded by six donor countries (Germany, the Netherlands, Norway, the United Kingdom, Sweden and Switzerland) with the aim of promoting access to basic energy services for twenty million people around the world. Currently, the alliance is implemented by the German Cooperation (GIZ) in 26 countries in Africa, Asia and Latin America. In Peru, the project began in 2007 focusing on Arequipa, and from 2009, it has advised public and private institutions at the national level. In 2011 and 2013, EnDev, GIZ and the National Training Service for the Construction Industry (SENCICO) developed a project in towns in Ecuador where field evaluations were carried out applying the Control Cooking Test (CCT) protocol.



Natural disasters such as storms, floods, earthquakes and volcanoes severely affect developing countries and poor communities. This damage can be reduced with better information about populations and environmental risks. Satellite technologies, geographic information systems (GIS) and hazard analysis models are key to managing and mitigating disasters.

Our proposal focuses on the exchange of experiences through workshops and technical meetings, using technological tools and specialized images in weather forecasting, early warning, disaster monitoring and damage assessment. The use of geospatial information in all phases of risk management is key to improving responses, simulations and making informed decisions that reduce human and material losses.



Experience

In October and November 2023, an exchange of experiences was carried out between the Agustín Codazzi Geographic Institute (IGAC) of Colombia and the National Commission for Aerospace Research and Development (CONIDA) of Peru, to strengthen the transfer of knowledge in geospatial technologies after the pandemic. During the exchange, methodologies on land cover and use were shared, applicable to sectors such as agriculture, environment, disaster management and regional governments. In addition, cartography information was generated using Earth observation data. IGAC highlighted the good results obtained with the Random Tree methodology for land use.







Peru became the third country in the world chosen by the OECD to establish a Regional Competition Centre, joining South Korea and Hungary. The institution is also the headquarters of the Academy of the World Intellectual Property Organization (WIPO).

Within the Peruvian National Integrated Consumer Protection System, consumers who are exposed to discriminatory treatment by suppliers based on origin, race, sex, language, religion, opinion, economic condition or any other kind are protected. The National Institute for the Defence of Competition and the Protection of Intellectual Property (INDECOPI) has the duty to promote non-discrimination in consumption and to sanction any infringement of this fundamental right. Our offer is based on the design of strategies and policies to implement regulatory compliance, market monitoring and joint work with other State entities to combat discrimination through supervision in consumer protection.



Experience

Since 2020, the INDECOPI Special Monitoring Centre has been launched to emphasize monitoring activities to streamline the collection, processing and analysis of information obtained from various sources, through the use of artificial intelligence tools. In this way, we have gained insight into the facts, situations and problems that citizens face when purchasing a good or contracting a service. Between 2020 and 2021, within the framework of South-South Cooperation, training and feedback activities were developed between Peru and Uruguay to strengthen capabilities and exchange best practices in consumer protection, many of which were implemented in those countries.

The training includes: (i) identification of the components for the development of a collective trademark; (ii) development of the regulations for use aligned with a communication strategy; (iii) registration procedure; (iv) promotion of strategic alliances and dissemination actions, such as virtual platforms, guidelines, infographics, podcasts and videos; and (v) to share emblematic Peruvian cases.

Between 2021 and 2023, collective trademarks were promoted through various activities. In 2021, the highlights were a virtual conference with INDECOPI and the World Intellectual Property Organization (WIPO) on the protection of products and collective trademarks, a workshop with Bolivia to share the Peruvian experience, and a regional seminar with WIPO, the Spanish Agency for International Development Cooperation (AECID) and the Spanish Patents and Trademarks Office (OEPM) on associativity and collective trademarks. In addition, a compendium was prepared at the Asia-Pacific Economic Cooperation Forum (APEC acronyms in English) on collective intellectual property tools for economic reactivation. In 2023, an Ibero-American workshop on collective trademarks as regional development tools was held, with the participation of countries from the Ibero-American Industrial Property Project (IBEPI).

Experience

Between 2019 and 2024, activities were carried out to highlight Denominations of Origin, Geographical Indications and Traditional Specialties Guaranteed as development tools. In 2019, a seminar in Colombia addressed their academic application. In 2021, a webinar and a regional symposium on Geographical Indications, their relationship with brands and their economic impact were organized, with the participation of Colombia, Mexico and Guatemala. That same year, at the Intellectual Property for Food and Beverage Sector seminar, how intellectual property adds value to the gastronomic sector was analysed, benefiting Trinidad and Tobago. In 2023 and 2024, seminars of the IP Key Latin America project delved into how these tools promote economic development, focusing on their promotion among producers and their connection with collective brands. Countries such as Colombia, Ecuador, Bolivia and Chile participated, highlighting the potential of these initiatives for regional development.

Experience

The visit of community tourism experts from MINCETUR-Peru to Huila, in collaboration with cooperation agencies from Peru and Colombia, promoted the strengthening of community tourism in the region. Tourist attractions were identified in municipalities such as San Agustín, Isnos, Pitalito and Palestina, and strategies were designed to create rural tourist routes, highlighting their cultural, historical and natural wealth. Peruvian experiences were transferred to strengthen knowledge in community-based rural tourism, empowering local communities and tour operators. The exchange of experiences was also promoted to prepare a technical document with promotional strategies. This collaboration laid the foundations for a sustainable and replicable tourism model. The Government of Huila is now working on a Roadmap to promote community-based rural tourism in the region.



- Specialized Route by Product or Prioritized Production Line: Offers services adapted to specific needs according to the production line.
- Specialized Route by Product-Market: Provides services focused on products or lines prioritized for specific markets.

Alternative, Comprehensive and Sustainable Development (DAIS) is aimed at changing the economic matrix towards a legal and sustainable economy, prioritizing the reduction of economic dependence on the illicit cultivation of cocaine towards the consolidation of legal markets to mitigate damage and promote the sustainable use of natural resources. Our offer is based on the dissemination of knowledge and experiences to replace illicit cocaine leaves with alternative crops, prioritizing the promotion of new crops in areas where cocaine is eradicated.

Between 2018 and 2019, the project "Advice on the implementation of the DAIS Program" was developed in favour of the National Anti-Drug Secretariat (SENAD) of Paraguay. The program benefited SENAD officials by contextualizing the Peruvian model in the alternative, comprehensive and sustainable development of the substitution of marijuana crops with the methodologies provided by the National Commission for Development and Life without Drugs (DEVIDA), managing to formulate and develop its own alternative development programs. Currently, Paraguayan alternative development programs have annual fiscal budgets and are implemented by SENAD, being part of the anti-drug policy of the country.

This service, provided by the Animal Health Diagnostic Centre, includes laboratory biosafety, sample quality verification, sample processing by real-time PCR tests, use of reference standards, as well as analysis and interpretation of results. The National Agricultural Health Service of Peru (SENASA) has high-tech equipment, highly qualified staff and standard operating procedures aligned with the reference laboratories of the World Organisation for Animal Health (WOAH).

RIS are the set of organizations that provide or make institutional arrangements to provide an equitable and comprehensive portfolio of health services to a defined population through articulation, coordination and complementarity that is accountable for health and administrative results and for the health status of the population they serve. In this context, the Ministry of Health (MINSA) has established a Geospatial System for Integrated Health Networks (GEORIS) that allows for the collection, analysis, identification and interoperation of primary and secondary information from various inter-institutional sources at the national level in a modular manner. GEORIS is the technological support for decision-making by RIS based on the assigned territory, which uses information from the health sector and other social sectors to improve health services. Our offer is based on the design of strategies and policies to implement Integrated Health Networks (RIS) in other States, through the experience and recognition obtained in the development and implementation achieved.



Experience

Since 2019, the implementation of the Geospatial System of Integrated Health Networks (GEORIS) was launched for the benefit of the entire population of Peru (33,039,912 inhabitants). This development was recognized by the Sasakawa Award in 2020, which was awarded by the World Health Organization (WHO). In addition, through a Supreme Decree and a Ministerial Resolution, the National Plan for the Implementation of Integrated Health Networks was approved, making use of this technological tool (GEORIS) registered with INDECOPI at the country level.

Mixed model of organization and formalization of blood banks with sanitary authorization to operate in Peru





Offer details

The model of Blood Banks in Peru evolved from small, intra-hospital units with technical deficiencies, towards a mixed model that combines centralized and decentralized blood banks.

Our offer is based on the dissemination of knowledge and the exchange of experiences in the mixed model of organization and formalization of blood banks in Peru. This evolution process, led by the Blood Bank and Hemotherapy Directorate (DIBAN), seeks to guarantee quality, safety and efficiency in the transfusion chain. Currently, 345 Blood Banks are authorized, improving access to haemocomponents components throughout the country, even in remote areas.



Experience

This model has been implemented since September 2022, benefiting 243,225 transfused patients nationwide. Currently, 345 blood banks operate with health authorization, supported by the National Multisectoral Health Policy to 2030. Technical assistance will be offered face-to-face and/or virtually, including visits to blood banks, such as the San Martín Regional Blood Bank and the Centro Hemodador Regional Loreto.

Offer details

The Ministry of Health of Peru, through the Mental Health Directorate, has implemented 276 Community Mental Health Centres (CSMC) nationwide. These centres offer comprehensive services for the promotion, prevention, treatment and rehabilitation in mental health, including addictions, for all stages of life. They also provide technical support to non-specialized establishments and collaborate with social actors to strengthen community mental health.

Our proposal is based on the exchange of experiences on the decentralization of Community Mental Health Centres (CSMC), which has brought quality services, specialists, medications and psychotherapeutic interventions to all regions of the country. This strategy has expanded care coverage, reduced treatment-free times in severe cases and strengthened community participation, ensuring equitable access to mental health services nationwide.



Experience

Since 2015, community mental health services in Peru have benefited 14.3 million people, increasing mental health coverage from 1.9% in 2017 to 35.5% in 2023. 286 mental health centers and 94 protected homes for people with mental disorders have been implemented, in addition to offering free medications. The availability of psychologists and psychiatrists has also improved.

Drawing on experience in community mental health, activities such as visits to health facilities and sheltered homes are offered, as well as training in sheltered home management, budgetary programs and mental health legislation.

Our offer is based on the transfer of experience acquired through the CDC-Minsa pyramidal training program, based on the principle of "learning by doing", and aims to strengthen the skills of professionals in the National Epidemiology Network (RENACE). It allows leading the epidemiological surveillance system, health intelligence, and the response to outbreaks, emergencies, and public health events (EVISAP). It is structured in three levels: Basic (3 months), Intermediate (9 months), and Advanced (2 years). In addition, the National School of Public Health (ENSAP) accredits those who meet the requirements established in the program's curricular design.



Experience

Since 1989, the Field Epidemiology Training Program (FETP) has trained 7 cohorts of field epidemiology specialists. It has also carried out joint actions with neighbouring countries and is a member of the South American Field Epidemiology Network (REDSUR). In this context, Frontline (basic) level cohorts have been developed and participated in with Colombia and Chile, with Chile at the intermediate level, and with Bolivia at the advanced level. In addition, graduates of the program are international leaders in the field of epidemiology and work in world-renowned institutions. The diversity of ecological niches in the country allows for a wide range of options to address various metaxenic diseases and other problems of interest in public health.

Technical assistance for the accreditation of donor and transplant health establishments and histocompatibility laboratories





Offer details

The accreditation of health establishments for organ and tissue transplants aims to guarantee the quality and optimization of donation and transplant processes in the country. This procedure enables accredited establishments to perform the extraction and transplantation of human organs and tissues. It is important to highlight that transplant programs cover organs and tissues such as heart, liver, lung, kidney, pancreas, cornea and hematopoietic progenitor cells. Our technical assistance offer shall be developed as follows:

- Training on requirements for the accreditation of health establishments and histocompatibility laboratories.
- Workshop for the documentary evaluation of the requirements necessary for accreditation.



Experience

Since 2007, the accreditation procedure for health establishments for transplants in the country has been regulated by technical standards approved by the MINSA, updated in 2019. The General Directorate of Donations, Transplants and Blood Banks has led this process, achieving to date:

- The accreditation of 48 health establishments for the performance of organ and tissue transplants.
- A total of 163 accreditations, including transplant programs, histocompatibility laboratories and tissue banks.

On 30 January 2020, the WHO declared an International Health Emergency due to the rapid spread of COVID-19, and on March 6, the first case was confirmed in Peru. The Peruvian Government declared a National Health Emergency on March 11.

Our offer is based on the exchange of experiences at the launch of Line 107 of EsSalud, a free telephone service available 24 hours a day to offer guidance and prevention on COVID-19. Initially focused on the virus, the service was expanded to cover other health needs. Through the Continuous Improvement Cycle, problems such as the lack of a specialized channel and a shortage of medical personnel were identified, which were solved by implementing protocols, a referral directory and a care system focused on user satisfaction, in addition to expanding the telephone lines.



Experience

EsSalud 107 Line, launched in March 2020, has served insured and uninsured people with health guidance and prevention, registering more than five million calls and saving more than 100 million soles by reducing visits to health centres. This initiative has improved access to health care, aligning with the Sustainable Development Goals (SDG 3) for health and well-being. Its replicability, sustainability and efficiency have consolidated it as a key communication tool, achieving the QUALITY SUSTAINABILITY AWARD 2024 and qualifying to compete in the international QSA GLOBAL 2024 awards.







National Superintendence of Health - SUSALUD

SUSALUD is responsible for protecting the health rights of every Peruvian, placing the citizen at the centre of the health system, regardless of their place of care or insurance status. It has the power to act on all Health Care Provider Institutions (Ipress) and Health Insurance Fund Administrators (Iafas), both public, private and mixed, throughout the country. Its actions are based on four lines of work: (i) promote, protect and restore health rights at the national level; (ii) prevent the violation of said rights; (iii) support risk management to achieve the institutional objectives of the health system; and (iv) modernize institutional management through intersectoral coordination and the integration of information systems, to optimize the protection of health rights.

Our offer is based on the exchange of experiences in health conciliation, a service that facilitates the resolution of health disputes through a neutral and specialized third party (conciliator), who manages the procedure to reach satisfactory agreements between the parties. These agreements are formalized in a document with the same legal value as a court ruling. This mechanism strengthens access to justice in health matters, promoting equity, the protection of rights and the continuous improvement of health services. Furthermore, it offers a fast and accessible alternative that reduces the burden on traditional judicial systems, benefiting both patients and healthcare institutions.



Experience

In 2024, an exchange of experiences in citizen participation in the health sector was carried out with the ECI beneficiary, SUPERSALUD in Chile. This exchange benefits approximately 15,704,000 people accessing health services in Chile, proving to be sustainable and replicable in that country. The collaboration was developed through periodic internships between SUSALUD of Peru and SUPERSALUD of Chile.



Modern techniques applied in animal science with a focus on the conservation of native animal genetic resources of Peru





Offer details

The thematic area seeks to preserve and enhance native species such as camelids, guinea pigs, ducks and Creole livestock (cattle, goats and sheep) through a comprehensive approach that combines scientific research, biotechnology, community education and public policy.

Our offer is based on the exchange of experiences regarding the implementation of actions such as genetic characterisation, creation of germplasm banks, in situ and ex situ conservation, and their integration into sustainable agro-ecological systems. Development of awareness programmes to strengthen knowledge and community participation, while fostering cooperation between institutions, governments and international networks, thus guaranteeing the genetic, cultural and economic sustainability of these species and breeds.



Experience

The Directorate of Genetic Resources and Biotechnology, through its Sub-Directorate of Genetic Resources, is developing an integrated conservation scheme using omics, digital tools and satellite indices to analyse spatio-temporal aspects in the conservation of species such as South American camelids. This approach evaluates their adaptability, thermal comfort and productivity.

The zoo genetic resources team applies software and machine learning for morphological studies, generating three-dimensional models. In addition, it combines cellular, histological and molecular research to understand animal adaptations to climate change. These initiatives consider the potential of agrobiodiversity zones in Peru, integrating plant and animal genetic resources.

The National Institute for Agrarian Innovation (INIA) has developed Good Agricultural Practices (GAP) to improve potato production, promote sustainability, ensure food safety and protect the environment.

Our offer focuses on the exchange of knowledge through courses that cover GAP at all stages of cultivation, from land selection with crop rotation and soil analysis, to processing with handling and traceability practices. The GAP emphasizes the use of certified seeds, analysis-based fertilization plans, efficient irrigation systems, integrated pest control, and harvesting and storage techniques that ensure product quality. In addition, emphasis is placed on ongoing farmer training and detailed recording of practices to ensure efficient, sustainable, and high-quality production in potato cultivation in Peru.



Experience

The course is presented in a theoretical and practical way in 3 modules and has been constantly updated for 2 years. The topics to be covered in each module are Module I: Selection of land, seed, varieties. Health, safety and well-being of workers; Module II: Sowing tasks, agronomic management of the crop, phytosanitary control, use and management of biological control agents and Module III. Management of the harvest and post-harvest, selection, classification and storage of potatoes for consumption, processing, seed and implementation of records.

Specialised in the conservation and proper use of natural resources, IIAP focuses on the sustainable development of the Amazonian population, especially in rural areas. It carries out research, projects and studies in various areas, providing technical assistance and promoting the adoption of results to improve social, economic and environmental indicators, especially in indigenous and rural communities in regions such as Amazonas, San Martín, Loreto, Huánuco, Ucayali and Madre de Dios.

Technologies for the production of native Amazonian fish





Offer details

Our offer is based on the exchange of experiences on production technologies for native Amazonian fish. IIAP is researching new species with high economic potential for the Peruvian Amazon region, such as the mullet, the mota and the mullet, which are in high demand in regional and international markets due to the quality of their meat, performance and flavour.

IIAP has managed to reproduce the mullet in captivity through hormonal induction, overcoming cannibalism and reaching a 50% yield in fillets. Currently, balanced diets and fattening systems are being developed for its sustainable cultivation. In Huánuco, a technological package is being optimized for the mullet, which is cultivated with economic diets. The mota, whose capture has increased, has high levels of mercury, so IIAP promotes its production in captivity as a sustainable alternative.



Experience

Between 2023 and 2024, the project "Reproductive strategies and embryonic development of Colossoma macropomum" was developed with professionals and technicians from the Aquatic Resources Authority of Panama (ARAP), contributing to finding solutions to the problem of reproductive performance of the Colossoma macropomum broodstock at a station of the aforementioned institution. From our knowledge, we were able to exchange experiences in the application of new technologies in order to achieve the objective. The results obtained allowed us to create work protocols so that the experience can be replicated in other broodstocks.

Camelid breeding, an ancestral practice in the high Andean region of Peru, is key to its economy. The country is home to 65% of the world's vicuñas and 87% of the alpacas, leading the export of their fibers. The growing international demand has driven the improvement of production processes, technical standards to reduce losses and guarantee animal welfare. In addition, support services have been strengthened, such as the work of expert fiber classifiers, to optimize production and marketing.

Our offer is based on transferring the experience acquired in the value chain through short courses, where experiences are exchanged on:

- Good shearing practices and handling of alpaca fleece
- Good livestock practices: animal welfare in the alpaca shearing process.
- Categorization and classification of alpaca fleece.

Offer details

Our offer is based on the transfer of experience acquired in the national implementation of two types of agricultural insurance: Catastrophic Agricultural Insurance (SAC) and Co-financed Agricultural Insurance (SAGRO). Both are financed with resources from the Guarantee Fund for the Countryside and Agricultural Insurance (FOGASA).

SAC is free insurance, 100% financed by the State, aimed at the most vulnerable farmers, especially those dedicated to subsistence family farming. Its objective is to provide compensation that allows farmers affected by catastrophes to recover and reintegrate into agricultural activity. On the other hand, SAGRO is an optional insurance, co-financed by the farmers and the State, intended for producers with greater productive capacity and commercial purposes. The State covers 80% of the cost of the premium, and the coverage protects the capital invested in agricultural or livestock activity.



Experience

The SAC and its climate risk transfer mechanism were implemented since the 2009-2010 agricultural campaign, initially in seven departments. Currently, the twenty-four departments of the country have Catastrophic Agricultural Insurance. As for SAGRO, it was implemented with 80% cofinancing since July 2023 throughout the national territory.



Our offer consists of a course-workshop aimed at capability building Our offer consists of a course-workshop aimed at capability building of the actors involved in the promotion of scientific culture. This course will take as a reference the experience of the Science and Technology Clubs, implemented by CONCYTEC between 2017 and 2024, which have generated valuable lessons learned and achievements in terms of national policies, participation of stakeholders and the general population. These experiences are serving as a basis for the design of a new strategy to promote scientific culture in Peru. The methodology will be participatory, integrating international bibliography to support the proposed strategies.



Experience

Since 2017, CONCYTEC has promoted Science and Technology Clubs to strengthen scientific culture in educational institutions. In its first phase, the National Network of Science and Technology Clubs was created, and in the second, despite the pandemic, the Integrated Management System for Science and Technology Clubs (SIGECCYT) was implemented to manage information in 195 provinces. Currently, there are 8,935 clubs with more than 102,000 students and 9,800 teachers, developing activities in Science, Technology, Engineering and Mathematics (STEM) with an inclusive approach. These clubs promote participation in Science, Technology, and Innovation (STI), reducing gaps and fostering interest in science and technology.

Offer details

Our offer focuses on sharing the experience of the Public Prosecutor's Office's national restorative juvenile justice program, which guarantees effective juvenile criminal justice and protects the rights of adolescents in conflict with the law. The program promotes their social reintegration through Fiscal Remission, a restorative approach that also seeks to repair damage to victims and to the community.

The process is divided into three stages: Initial assessment; comprehensive psychosocial assessment; and; accompaniment and follow-up. An interdisciplinary team personalizes strategies and coordinates with allied institutions to offer education, health, and technical training to adolescents.



Experience

Peru leads in LATAM the resolution of criminal legal conflicts for adolescents at a pre-trial level. In 2022, within the framework of the project "Rehabilitation and Reintegration of young people involved in organized crime in the Latin American and Caribbean region", the Peruvian Fiscal Remission model and the National Restorative Juvenile Justice Program were analysed, together with experts from the European Commission. In the same year, together with the Inter-American Drug Abuse Control Commission (CICAD) and the Organization of American States (OAS), the "Cost Study for the Therapeutic Justice Program in Peru" was carried out for the design of the Institutional Protocol and the launch of the Therapeutic Justice Project, expanding to more regions in 2024. Both activities benefited some 60 professionals (prosecutors and multidisciplinary technicians), promoting sustainability and replicability in Latin America in key areas such as health, education, and labour.

Detection and protection of women at risk, and followup of investigations related to attempted and completed femicides





Offer details

The Public Prosecutor Office of Peru, through its Crime Observatory, implements the "360° Strategy" to detect and protect women at risk, as well as to follow up on investigations of femicide and attempted femicide. Based on evidence from the Femicide Registry, which has been in operation since 2009, the strategy collects national information on cases and history of violence of the victims.

Our offering focuses on the design of strategies and practices through a Knowledge Management System aimed at detecting and protecting women at risk. This strategy has evolved from a manual approach to an automated system supported by technology and validated evidence. It currently incorporates an Alert Management System that automatically identifies women at risk, notifying prosecutors and multidisciplinary teams to implement protection and assistance measures. Recognized as good practice in Latin America, this methodology integrates strategic analysis and technology to effectively combat gender violence.



Experience

Between 2016 and 2023, exchanges of experiences were conducted within the framework of the Triangular Cooperation project between El Salvador, Peru and Spain, aimed at institutionalizing an information system that allows for the qualitative and quantitative analysis of the phenomenon of feminicide violence in El Salvador. Likewise, a second phase of this cooperation was developed, focused on consolidating a Knowledge Management System to generate evidence on feminicide violence in El Salvador, based on the experiences of Peru and Spain.

The National Cuna Más Program aims to improve the child development of girls and boys under 36 months of age, who live in urban and rural areas in conditions of poverty and extreme poverty.

Our offer focuses on the exchange of experiences on the Day Care Service (SCD), a program that seeks to promote early childhood development, so as to reduce gaps in the cognitive, social, physical, and emotional development of infants.



Experience

The National Cuna Más Program has obtained positive results in the evaluation of the Service aimed at children from 6 to 36 months of age. This comprehensive service covers health, nutrition, safety, protection, affection, rest, play and skill development needs. It is offered from Monday to Friday, for 8 hours a day, in the Comprehensive Care Child Centres (CIAI), where female community workers play the roles of caregiver mothers, guide mothers and family guides. In addition, the food service is managed by female kitchen partners, in charge of storing and preparing food for children.

The Saberes Productivos (Productive Knowledge) program aims to improve the social inclusion of older adults living in poverty, users of Pension 65, through the recovery and transmission of traditional knowledge. The program encourages the participation of older adults in cultural, social, and economic activities, strengthening a local support network and promoting their well-being and self-esteem.

Our offer focuses on the exchange of experiences on the key processes of the program: institutionalization in local governments, identification and recovery of knowledge, community appropriation through intergenerational transmission, and promotion of productive ventures. Through these activities, older adults are made visible and valued, involving them in decision-making, commerce, and training spaces, which contributes to their economic and social inclusion.

Experience

Saberes Productivos began in 2013 and since 2014 it has been implemented in all regions of the country, increasing the participation of districts and users. In 2023, it was implemented in 1,024 districts with 83,379 participants, and by October 2024, in 1,174 districts with 109,788 participants. Throughout its 11 years, it has promoted the participation of older adults in social, cultural, political, and economic life, improving their self-esteem and fostering local support networks. The program has been recognized and has been incorporated into three national public policies for its sustainability and expansion.
